EDUCATIONAL OPPOORTUNITIES – PWCC offers three different benefits for members.

<u>Wednesday Carve-In -</u> An informal gathering where member carvers gather to share knowledge, useful technical information, experiences, etc. related to carving. This is the place to bring your project to show, ask for help, etc. There is no fee/charge. Many times, members will bring material to share with colleagues.

<u>Club-Ed</u> – Club-Ed is a scheduled event, usually a specific project or activity lead by volunteer member and intended for members. The leader/instructor is not paid, but a small fee may be charged and paid to the leader/instructor. Generally, these are less than a day. Sign-up and scheduling are administrated by Betty Card (bettycard15@gmail.com).

<u>PWCC WORKSHOP/SEMINARS</u> – PWCC periodically engages instructors (PWCC member or not) to lead a workshop in their area of expertise. The instructor is paid a tuition fee collected and paid by PWCC. The instructor may have the materials fee included in the tuition or may charge and collect the material fee.
