# MEMBERS DISCUSSIONS

#### HINTS FROM DAVE SIKKELLEE

If you take very light cuts with your knife just shaving a little off at a time, you will find that when you get to the end of your carving, you will have very little sanding to do on the carving. Slow and easy as they say.

Betty comments: I can not accomplish this feat. It takes practice. My objective is to one day look at a carving and say, "Yes, I can. I did it."

#### HINTS FROM LILA GILMER

If you are doing a head or face these tips might come in handy.

Using a straight pin with a ball on the end of it, poke 1 in each eyeball. Look at the pins from the side and you might see them out of line. Line them up then check from the top and check to see if they are lined up. Keep lining them up from each direction until they are where you will want them on your carving.

Ears are another. Put pins in the ears as if you were going to clean them out. Do the same thing with them. Check them from the front and realign until you get them right; check them from the top, bottom etc. and continue realigning them until you have them reasonably in line.

Lila also mentioned if you are doing any face parts, ears, nose, mouth etc. you have many models around you. Husbands, wives, children, neighbors etc.

# **NEWEST PWCC MEMBERS**



# **BREAKING NEWS**

The members of PWCC who knew Caron Wilson were saddened by the news of her death although we all knew she was enduring a lengthy battle with cancer.

We all want to remember the vibrant, wonderful person Caron was. I think I, for one will always remember her ready smile even when you could tell she was in pain. I also remember the wonderful way she combined her wooden carvings and succulent plants into artistic arrangements using what Mother Nature supplied.

These following words were excerpts from comments of a friend of Caron who posted on her Facebook page. Caron Wilson passed away on April 6, 2023. For 37 years, she was the owner and manager of Freehaven Farm, a fiber farm with sheep, llamas, alpacas, emus and other animals she loved deeply. Through Freehaven, she instructed wood carving, spinning, weaving and sold equipment and materials for textile arts.

She had a special bond with animals and was truly gifted with the ability to care for them. She treated them with respect, love and sacrificed for them over her own wants and needs many times. At the end of her life, her greatest concerns were that her animals and the farm be taken care of properly and expressing gratitude to all that were there for her.

She will be remembered most for her love of animals, her artistry in fiber and wood, and her unwavering commitment to teach others to continue these skills and protect the Earth.
