# **Education Director Dick Card**

The Difference between Seminars & In-house Classes.

PWCC seminars are taught by Pros either from our club or other clubs in the U. S. or Canada. They charge according to their own policy. PWCC collects but gives the payments to the pros after the completion of the class. Carvers who attend the seminar do not have to be PWCC members, but they must abide by the rules on the registration forms. FORMS AND CHECKS MUST BE MAILED BY CERTAIN DATES AS ADVERTISED

Members Only In-House Classes are taught by our member carvers. Some of these men and women are also pros, **BUT THESE CLASSES ARE FREE TO MEMBERS ONLY** with minimal charge for wood and material. # Tom Gow's Challenge

With the start of this newsletter, Tom Gow started this challenge page to get people to show their carvings. Now he has decided to show one of his carvings again. But first please read the story behind this carving.

Tom's story: Janis and I visited Custer State Park in the Black Hills of South Dakota earlier this year. While driving the wildlife loop in the park, we stopped at the Wildlife Visitor's Center. As soon as I saw it, I knew I had to try and carve a likeness of it. I took pictures of all sides and use them as reference material for the carving.

Years ago, after deciding cottonwood bark was my preferred material, I gave all my basswood away and said I'd never carve on any wood but bark again.


Well .....never say never! Now, I knew I would need more material for this carving than what I could get using bark. So ..... I glued four pieces of basswood, 4" x 6" x 6" long together. I started on the carving in mid-September and it will span several weeks before completion.
