PAY ATTENTION. As Sharon mentioned in the last newsletter, this show will depend on registrations and on auction items for income to offset the cost. At the last Club meeting people voted for a Christmas tree for the auction. That means that members must supply Christmas ornaments to fill the tree. So we are calling for YOU ALL TO START CARVING CHRISMTAS ORNAMENTS.

If you want to put your ornament into competition, you can do so by taking a picture (small enough to hang on tree) of what you are donating. After the judging and prize awards are announced, those carvings go to the auction committee to be put on the tree IN PLACE OF YOUR PICTURE when it is auctioned.

Ornaments can be turned in at any time to Kendle or any board member.

Special Notes to Members

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ENTERING YOUR CARVING INTO COMPETITION AND HAVING A TABLE FOR DISPLAY.

Any carvings entered into competition will be displayed on special tables set up for them. They will not have names on them but after the judging you can display a card by your carving with your name. Most people who sell do this.

Having a table of your own for display. Here you can put any carvings of yours to display. I suggest you do so even if it's only the first and last piece you've carved. You can sell from these tables if the items are wood related. More instructions will be issued in the future. You can share a table with others also and split the cost. But please be willing to hang around your table and carve or just sit and talk to anyone who shows up and wants to know more about carving. But remember if you put any of your carvings into competition YOU CAN NOT PUT A PICTURE OF IT ON YOUR TABLE. All carvings in the competition are anonymous until after judging. But you can put pictures of your past or present carvings (many people give their carvings away as fast as they carve them) on your table if you don't want to bring the piece into the show.

More information about categories will be coming to everyone in the near future and I hope to put some more hints for carvers who are planning to enter the competition in future issues.


