Charlie recommends a wide thin flat ground honed blade for this type of carving. Charlie is usually at the Wednesday meetings so please ask him for advice on your existing knives. The most important features for the knife will be 2 " long thin sharp blade, "the sharpest tool in your box".

Be sure to sign up for this class ASAP. This is opened to all carvers & clubs, not just PWCC members. For this class to become reality, we need a minimum of 6 carvers with a maximum of 8.


