Lunch is on your own. Either bring your own or go out to numerous restaurant choices in the are.

Description and information on the class from the Instructor: This class will teach you the technique that Chris uses to create the "puffy" look she gets on her Quilted Stockings, Santas Snowman, Gnomes, Turtle shells, etc.

In this class the student will carve, burn and paint a Stocking. Once the student becomes familiar with the technique it can be applied to any of the other projects which could take 4-5 days in a class. A limited number of other project Roughouts will be available for purchase.

Tools and supplies the student should bring – sharp knives, v-tools, woodburner if you have one. Best to bring all the woodcarving tools you have, never know what you have size or shape wise that may work better. Tools and burners also available for purchase during the class.






